The Effect of TV News Video on Students' Listening Comprehension of First Year Students in SMAN 2 Tambang, Riau, Indonesia

Abstract:

Indonesian learners who study English as second language still get difficulty in listening because spoken and written languages are quite different. The objective of the research is to find out whether TV News video can give the positive effect towards students' listening Comprehension.

The research has been conducted during the period of March to April 2014. The population of this research was the 2013/2014 of the first year students SMAN 2 Tambang. The population is 52 students and the sample is 26 students. The instrument of this research is listening comprehension test based on the news video. The test consists of three topics of News video with 25 questions. The effectiveness can be seen in increasing students' listening comprehension by comparing average scores of pre-test and post test.

After analyzing the test, the researcher found that the mean score of post test is greater than pre test 60,92 for pre-test and, post test 80,92. The total df (n-1) or df (26-1) is 23. It was found that t-observation 4,3 on the level significant for two tail test is bigger than t-table It was found that the significant difference mean score of the research. Therefore, the null hypothesis is rejected and the alternative hypothesis is accepted. It means, TV News video can have a positive effect on students' listening comprehension.
